STATEMENT ON BULLYING & HARASSMENT

- The Glasgow Bar Association is committed to ensuring that all of its Members are treated with dignity and respect at all times as they carry out their professional duties.

Our Members should be able to carry out their professional duties and be treated with dignity and respect. Solicitors apply skill and dedication in often difficult and challenging circumstances and this should be respected.

- The Glasgow Bar Association believes that no Member should be subjected to harassment or bullying whether in court, police stations, prisons, or wherever else a Member carries out their professional duties.

Bullying or harassment of our Members is never acceptable behaviour no matter who it comes from. Behaviour like this prevents solicitors from properly carrying out their duties. It can also cause lasting harm, particularly for the younger or less experienced of our Members.

- The Glasgow Bar Association will provide such assistance and support as it considers appropriate in all the circumstances to any Member who believes they are being bullied or harassed in their professional life.
